Leo Lennox has an epic problem: it's his thirteenth birthday and he has just grown a tail.



Can Friday solve Highcrest Academy's many strange mysteries, including the biggest mystery of all-what's the point of high school?




Mapmaker Chronicles Series by Allison Tait




Our Australian Girl Series by Sofie Laguna, illustrated by Lucia Masciullo




The Wayward Witch and The Felling Monster Series

The Trials of Morrigan Crow Series by Jessica Townsend


